NINE FROM MOBERLY ATTEND NATIONAL MAIN STREET CONFERENCE

Nine Moberly residents attended the National Main Street Conference in Kansas City from March 25-28. They included Susan Hall, Kelsey Jeffries, Adam Flock, Diane Richardson, Paula Heath, Kim Buckman, Brian Crane, & Doug Sharp (representing Main Street Moberly, Farmers Market, Impacting Youth Wellness, City of Moberly, and Historic Preservation). David Gaines also attended (representing Brunswick Main Street). Northeast Electric Coop assisted with some financial scholarships.

Over 1600 attendees from across the country were present at the conference. There were over 100 training sessions and each of our representatives attended as many as six classes a day. Presentations and topics were widely varied. Everyone came home with lots of notes and brochures and booklets to share with the Main Street board and our downtown population.

At a debriefing meeting held after their return, several thoughts and ideas came to the forefront. Here are a few of them:

- * Helpful tips for renovating a second floor.
- Using second floor apartments as Air B&B units
- Every city/town has CAVE people. (Citizens Against Virtually Everything)
- More and more people can live anywhere they want because they work from home. They want a place that makes them feel "rooted" instead of "stuck".
- People want to shop where they feel welcomed and have a personalized experience. That's where downtowns can outshine corporate retailers and service providers.
- People want to feel connected to their community.
- A downtown district needs to feel welcoming to everyone. If both an 8 year old and an 80 year old can have a good experience downtown, then you've reached your goal! Something of interest to every age group is important to reaching that goal.
- The first rule in business success: Average doesn't cut it anymore and neither does Above Average.
- There is concern about the internet killing brick & mortar retail. It is still only 10% of retail sales. Keep working hard to make your business successful; don't give up!




